

REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING
TOWN OF LAKE LUZERNE
MARCH 13, 2006

MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY SUPERVISOR MERLINO WITH THE FOLLOWING PRESENT: COUNCILMAN MCLAIN, COUNCILMAN WATERHOUSE, COUNCILMAN DIEHL. ALSO PRESENT WAS HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT PODWIRNY, ABSENT: COUNCILMAN SHIEL AND ATTORNEY RUSSELL THARP.

FLOOR OPEN TO PUBLIC FOR THREE MINUTES EACH TO SPEAK ABOUT THE UPCOMING VOTE ON PROCEEDING WITH OUTDOOR DRAMA:

STANLEY GOLDBERG – 9 HILLCREST DR. REPRESENTING THE COMMITTEE OF CONCERNED CITIZENS AND THE FOURTH LAKE ASSOCIATION. QUESTIONED THEIR GROUP BEING CALLED A HANDFUL OF NAY SAYERS IN A RECENT POST STAR EDITORIAL. MADE REFERENCE TO THE NEGATIVE RESULTS OF THE SUPERVISOR'S SURVEY. ASKED THE BOARD TO REJECT THE PROJECT IN LIGHT OF FINANCIAL AND LOGISTICAL CONCERNS.

PATRICIA GOLDBERG – 9 HILLCREST DR. THANKED THE BOARD FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO ATTEND HEARINGS THAT SHOULD HAVE BEEN HELD LAST YEAR. SHE SAID THE FOURTH LAKE RESIDENTS WILL NOT CONTRIBUTE TO THE OUTDOOR DRAMA AND URGED THE BOARD TO REJECT THE PROJECT. VOICED CONCERNS ABOUT THE IMPACT ON THE MUSIC CAMP AND CALLED THE PROJECT A PIPE DREAM WHICH WILL BURDEN OUR RESOURCES AND INFRASTRUCTURE.

VIRGINIA RUSSELL – RT., 9N- CAME TO LAKE LUZERNE AT 7 YRS. OLD. BECAME A PERMANENT RESIDENT AND BUSINESSWOMAN FOR 23 YEARS. THANKED THE BOARD FOR PUBLIC INPUT FORUM AND SPOKE IN FAVOR OF THE DRAMA, THAT STUDIES SHOULD GO FORWARD TO DETERMINE THE APPROPRIATENESS OF THE PROJECT. FAVORED INCREASES IN SALES TAX REVENUES AND EMPLOYMENT FOR THE AREA. THE STUDIES THEMSELVES WILL BE BENEFICIAL TO THE TOWN. SAID THE TOWN SHOULD NOT BE AFRAID OF THE UNKNOWN.

ARNOLD ALBERT – 337 LAKE TOUR RD. - QUESTIONS REGARDING WHO WILL FINALIZE BUDGET PREPARATIONS AND AUTHENTICATE IT. THE HIGHWAY GARAGE IS OVER BUDGET NOW. IS THE MONEY TO BE IN THE BANK PRIOR TO THE BEGINNING OF THE DRAMA?

MANFRED GOLDSTEIN – 18 BAY ROAD – FEELS THIS IS TOO RISKY A PROJECT FOR LAKE LUZERNE AND ONE WE CAN'T AFFORD. IF IT GOES

THROUGH THE TIMING SHOULD BE DIFFERENT, NOT JULY AND AUGUST TO OFFSET THE SLOWER MONTHS OF SUMMER.

DONNA COVELL – RT. 9 - CHAMBER OF COMMERCE MEMBER AND BUSINESS OWNER– ASKED THAT THE TOWN LOOK AT THE BIGGER PICTURE. BUSINESS IN LAKE LUZERNE HAS DECLINED. TAXES ARE GOING UP AND THE TOWN NEEDS SOMETHING TO HELP OFFSET INCREASES. WE ARE SUPPLYING THE LAND ONLY FOR THE PROJECT. WE NEED TO COMPETE WITH SARATOGA AND LAKE GEORGE FOR TOURISM AND INCOME. DO WE WANT A DUMP TO COME IN TO TOWN LIKE CORINTH IS FIGHTING OR DO WE

WANT SOMETHING CULTURAL. HOW DO WE WANT TO GROW? SHE FEELS THE OUTDOOR DRAMA IS WORTHWHILE.

HARRY CRONIN – 125 GAGE HILL RD. – HAS BEEN IN GOVERNMENT IN LAKE LUZERNE IN SOME FORM FOR 47 YEARS. HE COMMENDED THE BOARD FOR THEIR WORK ON THE PROJECT. FEELS THAT THE OUTDOOR DRAMA STUDIES SHOULD MOVE FORWARD TO A SECOND STAGE AND MORE STUDY AND ASKED THAT THE COMMUNITY WORK TOGETHER.

MARY CLAIRE NOAKES – 12 TOWNER RD. AGREED WITH VIRGINIA RUSSELL . SPOKE AS A 40 YEAR RESIDENT, BUSINESS OWNER, FORMER SCHOOL TEACHER, . GIVE THE THEATER A CHANCE TO IMPROVE AND GROW THE COMMUNITY.

BARBARA PERRY – FENWAY DR. FORMER COUNCILWOMAN PERRY ATTENDED THREE OUTDOOR PRODUCTIONS AND GATHERED INFORMATION IN THE EARLIER STAGES OF THE PROJECT AND FEELS THAT IT SHOULD GO FORWARD AS A POSITIVE WAY TO MOVE THE COMMUNITY.

JOSEPH VORONOVICH – 47 ROSE AVE. – CAME FROM CALIFORNIA, LOVES THE AREA. IT WAS THE OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES AND RESOURCES THAT MADE HIM CHOOSE THIS AREA.

BOB MACKEY – LIVES IN GLENS FALLS BUT OWNS LUZERNE MARKET. LIONS CLUB MEMBER AND CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, SACANDAGA OUTDOOR COMMITTEE – AND MEMBER OF FALL FESTIVAL COMMITTEE. COMPARED TRAFFIC TO THAT OF PAINTED PONY IN THE SUMMER WHICH NO ONE COMPLAINS ABOUT. LIONS CLUB PARKS CARS THERE IN THE SUMMER AND HEARS NO COMPLAINTS. SPOKE IN FAVOR OF THE DRAMA.

FLOOR CLOSED:

DISCUSSION:

SUPERVISOR MERLINO: NOT EASY DECISION.. WE COULD BE FIGHTING BIG BOX STORES, TRASH, ETC.

COUNCILMAN MCLAIN - LIVES A FEW HUNDRED YARDS FROM WHERE IT WILL BE HELD. IT WILL COST THE TOWN NOTHING. THE NOT FOR PROFIT HAS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF COMING UP WITH OPERATION COSTS. IF IT FAILS WE STILL HAVE THE LAND WITH AN AMPHITHEATER TO DO SOMETHING ELSE WITH. IN THE LONG RUN IT COULD BRING REVENUES TO THE TOWN BY WAY OF THOSE WHO WILL VISIT AND PERHAPS MOVE HERE. NOISE CAN BE CONTROLLED. TRAFFIC ISSUES CAN BE STUDIED TO POSSIBLY ANOTHER ENTRANCE. FEELS IT WILL BE GOOD FOR THE TOWN AND GROW THE TOWN .

COUNCILMAN WATERHOUSE – WAS SKEPTICAL EARLY ON ABOUT BRINGING MORE PEOPLE TO TOWN IN JULY AND AUGUST. BUT HE MENTIONED HIS OWN YOUNG FAMILY WHO HE WOULD LIKE TO SEE BE ABLE TO GROW UP AND STAY HERE IN LAKE LUZERNE BECAUSE OF OPPORTUNITIES.

COUNCILMAN DIEHL: FEASIBILITY STUDIES ARE DONE TO SEE IF THIS IS A VIABLE PROJECT. WITHOUT THEM HOW DO WE COME UP WITH THE ANSWERS TO THE

QUESTIONS AND CONCERNS.

I WANT TO INCLUDE IN THIS RECORD THAT I DID NOT PARTICIPATE IN ANY WAY AS A MEMBER OR CONTACT PERSON OF THE CONCERNED CITIZENS COMMITTEE AGAINST THE OUTDOOR DRAMA. THEIR LETTER CAME TO MY ATTENTION SHOWING MY NAME TYPED IN WHERE ONE NORMALLY SIGNS A LETTER INSTRUCTING PEOPLE TO CONTACT ME FOR A COPY OF THE SUPERVISORS NEWSLETTER IF THEY DIDN'T GET ONE . WHEN I SAW THE WAY THE LETTER WAS PUT TOGETHER, I WAS AFRAID THAT IT MIGHT LOOK AS THOUGH I WAS PART OF THE COMMITTEE. HIGHWAY REPORT: BRUCE PODWIRNY

ROAD SIGNS HAVE BEEN ORDERED FOR A PRIVATE DRIVE OFF EAST RIVER DRIVE CALLED VAN NOSTRAND WAY WHICH WILL BE PAID FOR BY THE VAN NOSTRANDS AND HAS BEEN INCLUDED IN THE 911 EMERGENCY SYSTEM AT WARREN COUNTY.

TOWN BOARD MET WITH THE FIRE DEPARTMENT REGARDING THE POWER OUTAGE OF FEB. 17TH IN ORDER TO DISCUSS AND MAKE BETTER PLANS FOR EMERGENCIES IN TOWN. THE FIREHOUSE NOW HAS A GENERATOR AND THE TOWN INTENDS TO USE THE FIREHOUSE AS AN AREA TO HOUSE PEOPLE IF NECESSARY WITH COTS AND

BLANKETS. THE TOWN HALL WILL ALSO BE USED AS A COMMAND CENTER. IT IS PROPOSED THAT THE TOWN HALL ALSO GET A GENERATOR IN ORDER THAT PHONE LINES WILL REMAIN OPEN. PRESENTLY PHONES WILL RUN 2 HOURS ON BATTERY BACKUP AFTER POWER GOES OUT.
